Getting Started

Drumtrax Librarian Overview

The Drumtrax Librarian is a database program designed to help you find and LAUNCH grooves quickly and easily. The Librarian lets you search and organize sequences by indexed keywords and categories. In addition, your own comments can be entered into the database to bookmark your favorite patterns or to organize sequences by project.

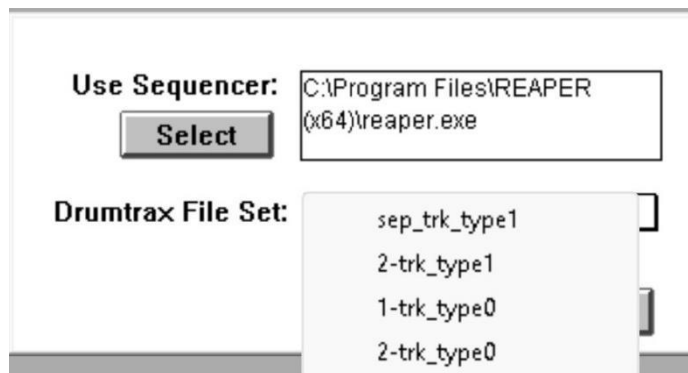

Please note: The Drumtrax Library files can OPEN or IMPORT directly into your sequencer program without using the Drumtrax Librarian. If this is the case, refer to the Drumtrax MIDI Drum Library File List document (shows file name, category, tempo, time signature and description).

Setting Preferences

This will link your DAW software to the Drumtrax Librarian
It's default setting is Windows Media Player



Tap the SELECT button and locate:

C:\Program Files*your DAW software* (Pro Tools, Logic, Cubase, Reaper, etc.)

NEXT Choose a **Drumtrax File Set** from the pull-down menu (all drum file sets default to MIDI channel 10)

sep-trk_type1 -each note on a separate MIDI track – for designing your own drum kit sounds from your MIDI gear

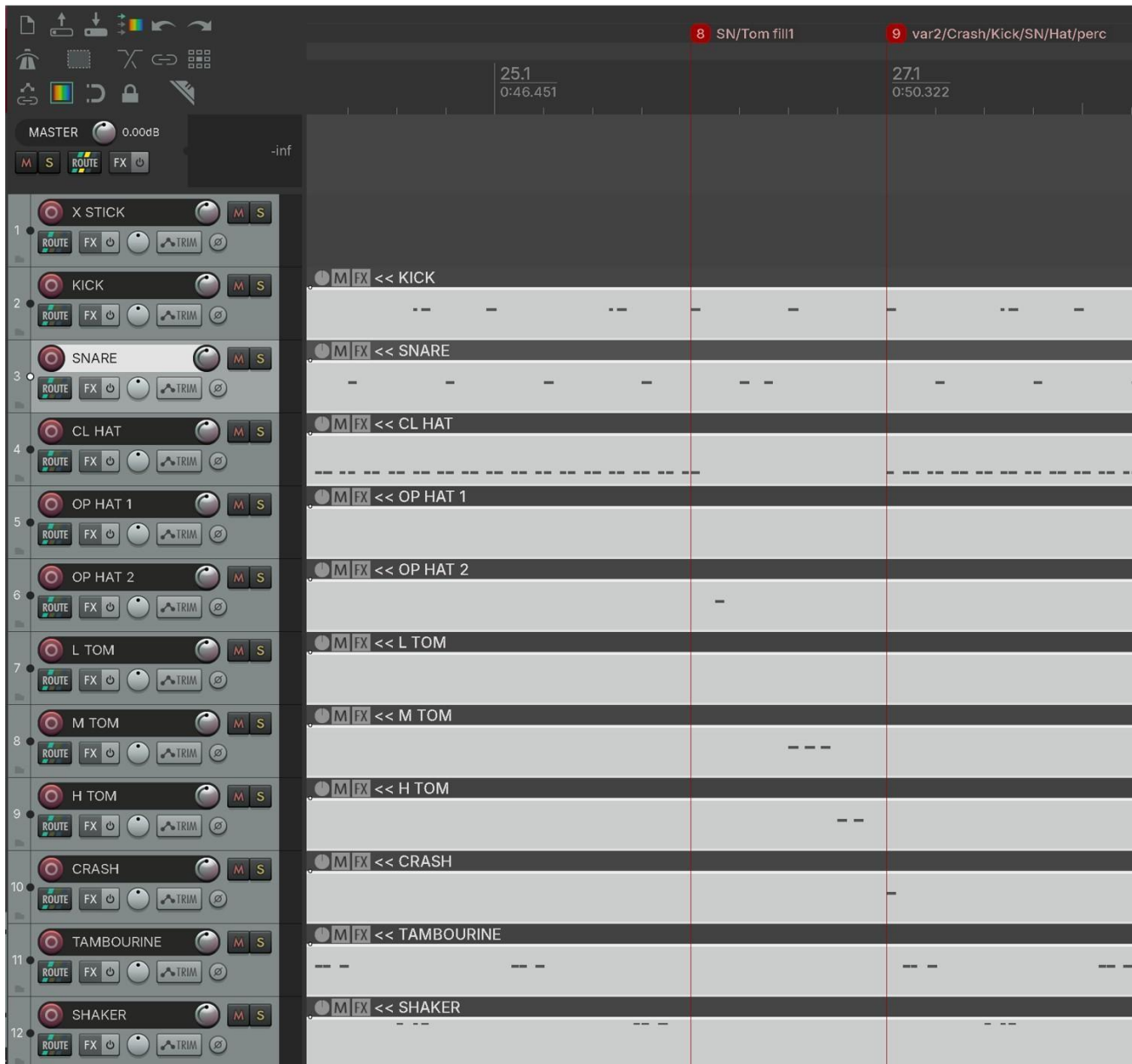
2-trk_type1 - 2 tracks - drums and percussion

1-trk_type0 - all notes on one MIDI track

2-trk_type0 - 2 tracks of drums and percussion

Choose one and tap **OK**

Launching Drumtrax MIDI Drum Library Files

From the Librarian window or from the Sequence File Card, you may launch any sequence by clicking on the Launch button. The Launch button automatically opens your sequencing software and the Drumtrax MIDI file sequence you have chosen. The Librarian will still be open in the background however, and you may return to it at any time to continue your search.

Markers Help Note Map

The **Drumtrax Librarian window** lists all of the sequences in the Drumtrax Library and information about each sequence. Tempos are in the file name (ALT_080 is T = 80).

Please Note: Speeding up or slowing down the TEMPO using your DAW program may help in the creative process as well.

The Librarian window also provides these user buttons:

Show All (re-lists all library files after a search)

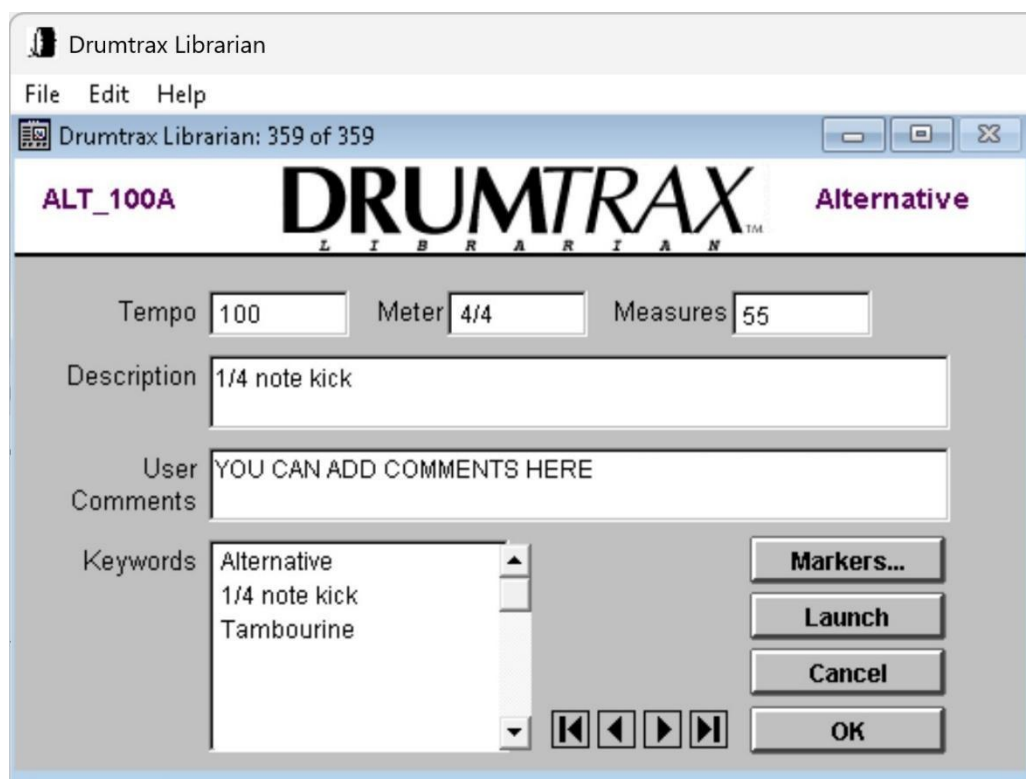
Search (opens Search Window)

Launch (launches files using the current MIDI sequencer)

Markers (shows measure information of highlighted record)

Note Map (shows General MIDI assignments for easy reference)

Sequence File Card



Double-clicking on a highlighted record in the Librarian window opens the Sequence File Card.

Markers Window (shows measure information of highlighted record)

Launch (launches files using current preferences)

Cancel (cancels all entered data and returns to Librarian window)

OK (saves all entered data and returns to Librarian window)

Adding User Comments

From the Sequence File Card, you may add comments to the User Comments field to help you customize your database. Type in the User Comments field to record your own opinions regarding the sequence or songs/projects, etc. User Comments can be used as a search vehicle in the Search Window. Your comments become keywords for personal criteria searches. (ex. Feels like SANTANA")

Search Window

To search for sequences using specific criteria, click the Search button on the Librarian window. From the Search window, you may fill in any of the search criteria fields. The Librarian then finds all of the files that match the exact data you've entered and returns to the Librarian window, where you may view the search results. The Search window provides the following fields: Sequence File (search for a specific sequence by name)

Tempo (search within a given range of tempos)

Meter (displays a list of time signatures)

Category (displays a list of categories in the Drumtrax Library)

User Comments (search by comments you have entered. Spelling counts!)

Search By Keywords

You may search for sequences using any of the keywords listed in the Keyword Choices list. By clicking on a keyword, it is then added to the Selected Keywords List. By clicking on the Any and Every button next to the Selected Keywords List, you can Find Sequences that contain any selected keywords (a broad search), or sequences that contain every selected keyword (a narrower search).

All of the sequences in the Drumtrax Library have been meticulously labeled to provide you with specific measure marker information. Many MIDI software sequencers support measure markers and they can often be viewed in a measure marker window (or equivalent) within your sequencer. Measure marker information can also be viewed from within the Librarian by tapping the Markers button on the file Card. (In the Librarian window you will see the measure markers for the currently highlighted sequence.)

All Drumtrax note assignments are mapped to the General MIDI Standard and are compatible with most manufacturers' defaults. If your instruments are General MIDI, you will find Drumtrax very simple to use. Percussion sounds may require some remapping, since the standard assignments among different manufacturers seem to vary above C5.

Unique Instruments

Certain unique instruments are labeled in Drumtrax sequences but are not compatible with some manufacturer's General MIDI note mapping.

Native Drums - these notes are compatible with General MIDI

Taiko Drums - try detuning down an octave.

Talking Drum - This is defaulted to another MIDI channel because it uses pitch bend (set to 2 half steps) in place of hand pressure on the drum head to vary tones. A high Surdo drum sound is a good substitute. try detuning up an octave.
